Since late 2016, the network co-produces a new research method OWEE (<u>Open Walked Event-Based Experimentations</u>) aiming at transforming jointly academic and entrepreneurial work practices. This method aims at becoming a commons for academics and entrepreneurs involved in it (e.g. with a sharing of the symbolic capital of impact and citations).
